News from the APRIM



Catholic identity at Rosary School is strengthened by the Dominican Pillars of Prayer, Study, Community, and Ministry. This year, the community is focusing on Prayer with the verse: When we choose to pray, we choose to grow. Mary, in her appearances to these three children, reminded them to "pray the Rosary". In my growing connection to this school community, the Rosary has taken on a new

significance for me; that praying the Rosary is incredibly powerful. This prayerful devotion to Mary has the power to bring peace, the power to heal, and the power to make a difference in our lives and in the lives of those we love.

There have been many opportunities for prayer in the Rosary School community. I have seen many vibrant prayers unfolding in our classrooms, around the school grounds as the children learn about their ecological connection and conversion, in the Liturgies and Eucharistic Celebrations run by each year level every week, and in our Family Masses each month. Through praying the Rosary, Mary teaches us that we "grow" through our individual and communal experience of prayer because prayer is the 'place' where we encounter grace. Prayer is where we slow down, calm down, let go, offer our struggles to God, listen and grow in our relationship with God.

Sacramental Program

We have had, in total, 64 children from Rosary School formally enrol in the Sacramental Program this year. 27 children received their Reconciliation in April. This will be followed by around 30 children, making their Confirmation and First Communion next term, (dates are below), with more enquiries coming into me, so I am guessing that there will be even more children.

A common question that I am asked is how long it should be between the Sacrament of Reconciliation and the Sacraments of Confirmation - First Communion. A full year needs to be left between these Sacraments so that the children can grow in their understanding of the Sacrament.

- 2. Confirmation and Holy Communion catch-up Session: Wednesday 13th August at Rosary School 5:30-6:30.
- 3. Confirmation and Holy Communion Ceremony: Sunday 24th August as part of the 10:00am Mass.





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
