I wish you all a peaceful break from the school routine and a Happy Easter.



News from the APRIM

When I am on yard duty, I often love having one which brings me into the courtyard at the end of the day. To see and hear the children when they greet their parent as they burst out of their classrooms, is quite joyous to see and hear. The courtyard becomes a happy greeting place where family and school community connect. When I think about what a Catholic school like Rosary School offers children and their families, it is about achieving excellent academic outcomes, being in a supportive environment, discovering ways of serving others, faith formation and exploring prayer and how this deepens children's spiritual life and relationship with God. Perhaps, most important of all is that Rosary School is a faith-centered community which works with the Church to deepen the roots of the parish-school relationship. Already this year, there have been quite a few events which strengthen this unified identity.

I attended the playgroup called Rose Buds@Rosary last Monday morning. I was immediately welcomed by Sera C, our Playgroup Coordinator, as well as the regulars. As I wandered around and introduced myself, I heard meany stories about the young children and their families.

As the children played, it became clear that the time spent between child and adult, whether it was between grandparent and grandchild, parent and child, or caregiver and child, it was very precious indeed.

As the children darted from activity to activity, it was hard to keep up to some of the grandparents, especially, and it was difficult to see who enjoyed the morning more! The children were interacting with each other, learning how to consider those around them as they shared and took turns whilst the adults were gaining the support of a network between parish and school.







The work and dedication which has been put into the playgroup has seen it thrive and give children a good start to their cognitive, social, and emotional development. It places them in a safe space which reaches out to a cross-section of people who draw from a Catholic-centered community.


Year 4 News


